## Permit Required for NC 54 Park and Ride Lot Starting Aug. 15

On Sunday, Aug. 15, the NC 54 park and ride lot, off of Highway 54 and Friday Center Drive, will become a University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill (UNC) permitted lot. A valid UNC permit will be required to park in the lot. Chapel Hill Transit (CHT) customers who are not eligible for a UNC permit may use other public park and ride lots in Chapel Hill and Carrboro, including Eubanks Park and Ride (on Eubanks Road, 1/2 mile west of Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd.); Carrboro Plaza Park and Ride (behind Carrboro Plaza at Hwy. 54 and Old Fayetteville); or Southern Village Park and Ride.
