RFQ: Parks & Recreation Master Plan

The Town of Chapel Hill is seeking a qualified consultant to prepare an updated Parks and Recreation Master Plan. The major purposes of the plan will be to identify the current state of the Parks and Recreation Department's facilities and to make recommendations for the future.

The plan will focus on recreation facilities and parks, but will also include to a lesser degree some evaluation of greenways. The master plan should systematically assess the Town's current and future needs for Parks and Recreation facilities. The plan should also provide an illustrative and usable plan to guide the Town of Chapel Hill's actions over the next ten years in regard to the development of its park facilities and programs.

The Master Plan will be completed only after a thorough inventory of existing parks, facilities, public input, research on current parks and recreation trends and standards, and finally input and concurrence from the Town Council.

Permits Required for NC 54 Park and Ride Lot Starting Aug. 15

On Sunday, Aug. 15, the NC 54 park and ride lot, off Highway 54 and Friday Center Drive, will become a University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill (UNC) permitted lot. A valid UNC permit will be required to park in the lot. Chapel Hill Transit (CHT) customers who are not eligible for a UNC permit may use other public park and ride lots in Chapel Hill and Carrboro, including Eubanks Park and Ride (on Eubanks Road, 1/2 mile west of Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd.); Carrboro Plaza Park and Ride (behind Carrboro Plaza at Hwy. 54 and Old Fayetteville); or Southern Village Park and Ride.

Share Your Thoughts on the "Campus to Campus Connector"

A Carolina North "Campus-to-Campus Connector" meeting will be held from 4 to 5:30 p.m. Thursday, Aug. 12, at the Chapel Hill Public Library. The public is invited to review the draft recommendation for the Campus to Campus connector for Carolina North and share input.

The meeting continues discussions on potential locations for a greenway and bike path connection between the Carolina North Campus and the Main UNC Campus. The path would not be located on Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard and should avoid steep grades where feasible. It may include existing or planned greenways for a portion of the route.

Staff members from the Town of Chapel Hill and UNC-Chapel Hill have worked together to review workshop comments and develop the draft recommendation. The final recommendations will be presented to the Town Council in September 2010.
