The Town of Chapel Hill will celebrate Arbor Day with a tree-planting ceremony at 11:30 a.m. Friday, Nov. 19, at the Homestead Aquatic Center, 300 Northern Park Drive.

During the ceremony, the Town will receive a Tree City USA Award from the North Carolina Division of Forest Resources. Students from Mrs. Morgan's second grade class at Seawell Elementary School will help plant a bald cypress tree (*Taxodium distichum*).
